Principal and Vice-Principal Report

- Due to principal Tim Hawes' injury on Labour Day weekend, Ann Arden, current vice principal, has been acting principal since October 10th until Hawes returns
- Darlene Laporte, a retired principal, is acting vice principal in Ann Arden's place
- Several field trips have occurred, including a SHSM best places to work job fair, a photography annual trip, and the Cappies Critics Training
- Three post-secondary presentations have occurred at Sir Wil this month, including UOttawa, Carleton and Algonquin
- LINK and leadership crew hosted games in the gym at lunch for grade 9 students, and Student Council has planned upcoming spirit activities
- The PD day on Oct 06 focused on literacy numeracy and mental health. The next PD day is Nov 24
- The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) will occur on Nov 28 and 29 for semester 1 students in ENG2D plus grade 11/12 students who still need to write. Semester 2 ENG2D students will write in the spring
- The Literacy Committee has been doing work with central staff on supporting emerging readers (fluency, comprehensive, phonics, scribing); the grade 8s last year did a screening tool which has been updated for the grade 9s this fall
- Progress reports went out on Oct 17 (initial learning update)
- Parent teacher interviews are tomorrow night (Oct 26)
- Midterm report cards will be out on November 21

- Grad photos will be Nov 21 and 22, and online booking information will be coming soon
- Arts Night will be Thursday November 30

Q: Why doesn't EQAO cover reading in grade 9 instead of grade 10? **A:** Instead of having students write every subject in 1 year, the EQAO test covers math in grade 9 and reading and writing in grade 10. All of Sir Wil's feeder schools had a reading screening tool with results sent to Sir Wil to provide targeted reading supports to students in class, and Sir Wil also screens incoming students in the fall

Q: Does Sir Wil run a language lab, where students learn through headphones and workstations with an oral component to the class?
A: Sir Wil does not have a language lab set up, but language classes do have workstation set ups and opportunities for students to listen to audio, work on tasks, etc.

Q: Are grade 9 and 10 students writing formal exams this year? **A:** Grade 11 and 12 students will be writing formal exams depending on the course, and grade 9 and 10 students will have summative assessments, evidence records, and other opportunities to show their learning, but no formal written exams. This is a district wide decision.

Q: Will students be at home during the exam writing period like last year? **A:** No, it will not be like last January. All students will be in school doing meaningful learning during the 5 exam days. Students will attend for the first 4 days, with the final day reserved for students requiring extra support and opportunities. Students will not attend the entire day but would be expected to come in during their class time.

Q: Can you explain Launch 2023?

A: Launch is the exploration of post-secondary options occurring November 1. Students in grades 10-12 are able to attend the conference virtually from home, allowing students to personalize their experience and watch presentations related to their interests. Teachers have also registered for the Launch activities and will be setting up presentations related to the subject during their class that day for students who attend. Grade 9s will be doing the Take Your Kids to Work on the same day. Bell times will be adjusted to align with the Launch sessions so that presentations are not interrupted. If students are attending from home, those without permission slips will be marked as absent, but will still be able to log in to the conference.
