Apply the creative process when performing and composing notated music and improvised music using a range of techniques as it relates to the elements of music.

Use critical analysis in responding to, analyzing, reflecting on, interpreting, and understanding music with respect to how it enhances personal development and society.

Apply the use of music theory, terminology, history, and performance conventions relating to music through various exercises
