

Grade Twelve Writer's Craft EWC 4U Course Outline Sir Wilfrid Laurier S.S.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This university preparation course emphasizes knowledge and skills related to the craft of writing. Students will analyze models of effective writing and use a workshop approach to produce a range of works and learn effective ways to improve their writing.

Unit 1: The Writing Habit

• Students will begin to practice daily free writing and be introduced to blog publishing.

UNIT 2: Identity and Community

• Students will come to understand who they are as writers and begin to form a supportive writing community with their classmates. Students will read a memoir and produce their own memoir relating a significant event in their life journey so far.

UNIT 3: Professional Writing

- Using selections from textbooks and various media, students will examine models of professional writing and journalism and produce writings of their own.
- Students will explore the content and layout of newspapers and magazines and then create a magazine as a member of a team.

UNIT 4: The Short Story

• Students will consolidate their understanding of the pattern and elements of the short story (plot, setting, character, theme, etc.) by writing and evaluating their own stories.

UNIT 5: Poetry

• Students will create poems using a variety of exercises and explore a range of forms and purposes.

UNIT 6: Grammar Smart

• Students will work through the text *Grammar Smart* with a focus on improving the quality and precision of their own writing.

The Summative: Part One: The Creative Project

• Students will be introduced to the creative project at the beginning of the semester, submit a proposal that will guide a conference with the teacher early in Term 2, engage in peer assessment, and present the final product the last week of class.

The Summative: Part Two: The Blog

• Students will create and publish an engaging online blog with at least ten entries. Students will also publish meaningful and encouraging comments about blog postings written by other students.

The Summative: Part Three: The Magazine

• Working in groups, students will write articles for and publish a magazine.

EVALUATION:

Course Work 70%

Summative 30%
