Photography (Visual Arts) - AWQ4M

Course Information & Evaluation

This course focuses on the refinement of students' skills and knowledge in photography. Students will analyze photographic works and use theories of photography in analyzing. Students will build on their prior knowledge of compositional theories, studio and natural lighting and seeing as an artist. Students will apply their knowledge using digital cameras, digital editing and reflection. Students will produce a body of work demonstrating a personal style. Students will learn in a project based hands on environment.
