## INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS AND STUDENTS

All students must take 8 courses in Grade 9: 6 compulsory courses + 2 elective courses

## 1. COMPULSORY COURSES:

As of September 2022, all grade 9 courses (in English and in French Immersion) are de-streamed as directed by the Ministry; we no longer offer a course at the Applied or Academic level.

When choosing your courses, the characters are very important:

Grade 9 course codes contain a "1" in the fourth position

French Immersion course codes contain an "F" in the sixth position

English ENL1W Geography CGC1WF Math MTH1W Science SNC1WF French and Phys. Ed

Students in the English program must choose **Core French** FSF1D.

Students in the French Immersion program must choose **French Immersion** FIF1D.

We offer 3 options for Phys. Ed: PPL1O (all genders), PPL1OP (female) and PPL1OQ (male).

## 2. ELECTIVE COURSES:

Students will choose 2 electives. All options are offered at the OPEN level as they are introductory courses; no prior knowledge is required. Some electives are offered in English or in French.

**For the 1**<sup>st</sup> **elective,** all students <u>must</u> choose a course in the ART category. Students in Music - AMU1O, may also participate in Band, a course offered after school from Sept. to June, for .5 credit. A Google Form will be sent to all students later in the spring.

*For the 2<sup>nd</sup> elective*, students can choose a course in the BUSINESS category or in the TECHNOLOGY category.



As of Sept. 2024, all students must take 1 Tech class, either in grade 9 OR in grade 10.
