Ineligible Activities

The Ministry of Education has developed a list of activities that may **not** be chosen as community involvement activities. These are referred to as ineligible activities.

An ineligible activity is an activity that:

- takes place during a student's scheduled class time. However, an activity that takes place during the student's lunch breaks or "spare" periods is permissible
- consists of duties normally performed in the home (i.e., daily chores) or personal recreational activities; helping immediate or extended family members
- would pay the students
- involves playing on a school sports team or any other club
- would normally be performed for wages by a person in the workplace
- Involves the student volunteering at a for-profit organization
- is a requirement of a class, course, or program in which the student is enrolled (e.g., cooperative education course, experiential learning activities)
- contravenes the minimum age requirements to work in or visit a workplace

A few examples of activities that are <u>not</u> eligible are: restaurants, garages, helping at home, babysitting, hair salons, construction, dental office, pharmacy, general office help, retail stores, vet office, for-profit or home daycares.
